Dear Dr. Rick:

This memorandum is in reply to your April 12<sup>th</sup> 2006 response in, which you returned my March 31<sup>st</sup> 2006 complaint, explaining that your computer, “is not able to download the documents,” that I made reference to in my March 31<sup>st</sup> 2006 complaint.

The compact diskette that accompanied my complaint contained Adobe PDF versions of the documents, so as to limit the needless production of paper. Adobe PDF, which requires a widely available free reader-software, is the accepted standard format in Colorado for e-filing in Colorado State Courts and the U.S. Court for the District of Minnesota. Nevertheless, for your convenience, I have printed out a paper-copy of each document, except for a copy of my August 20<sup>th</sup> 2004 recusal Motion, which consists of many pages and exhibits.<sup>1</sup>

The gist of my Complaint is that a recusal Motion was filed, docketed and even acknowledged by the respondent judge and that she has intentionally delayed ruling on that Motion for almost two years so as to suspend the proceedings under Rule 97 and, thereby, deny my access to the court.

Another essential point of my March 31<sup>st</sup> 2006 complaint is that delayed rulings are, indeed, among the offenses about which the Commission has addressed as within its jurisdiction. A copy of my complaint is also attached hereto for your convenience.
