We arrived in the US the day before Elders' Conference began for our regular biennial visit. We have been quite busy.

Chuck and Charles are working in construction during the day whenever they have the chance to help pay for our living costs while here.

Regina and the younger children are cleaning and mowing lawns to also help.

We have been sharing almost every Sunday in a different branch about how God is working in the mission field that we are in. Most evenings we visit different families and share about God's goodness to us. It has been such a blessing to be able to visit and share with so many of the Saints.

We would appreciate your prayers as we travel here in the mid-west sharing the good news that God is at work in His Church and throughout the world.

We plan on staying in the States until after the 4th of July so that Regina can visit an orthopedic surgeon because of problems with her elbow.

Regina will see the surgeon on May 15. At this time her arm has about 80% of its normal movement. It gets stiff in the mornings and does not have the strength it had previous to the gun

Sister Marta, Melida and brother Socorro visited sister Elba and her mother. Her mother is slowly recuperating. Some of us went to visit sister Briselda. The visit went well. The family came to church together on Wednesday.

Our North American brethren are working hard on the construction. We here in Siguatpeque had the opportunity to meet them. Today they will be returning to Siguatpeque because tomorrow there will be the monthly national ministers' meeting.

Here in Honduras many of the people are

alarmed. There is a religious group that believes a man is Jesus Christ in the flesh. This false Jesus will be coming to Tegucigalpa today. There are about 3,000 people waiting for his arrival. It is the talk of Honduras.

We know that the Bible says that false prophets will come among us. The Bible also says that when Jesus Christ comes every eye will see him, not just those who live in Tegucigalpa. We need to pray and prepare ourselves. It seems that the coming of Christ is near due to the many things that we hear are happening in the world.
