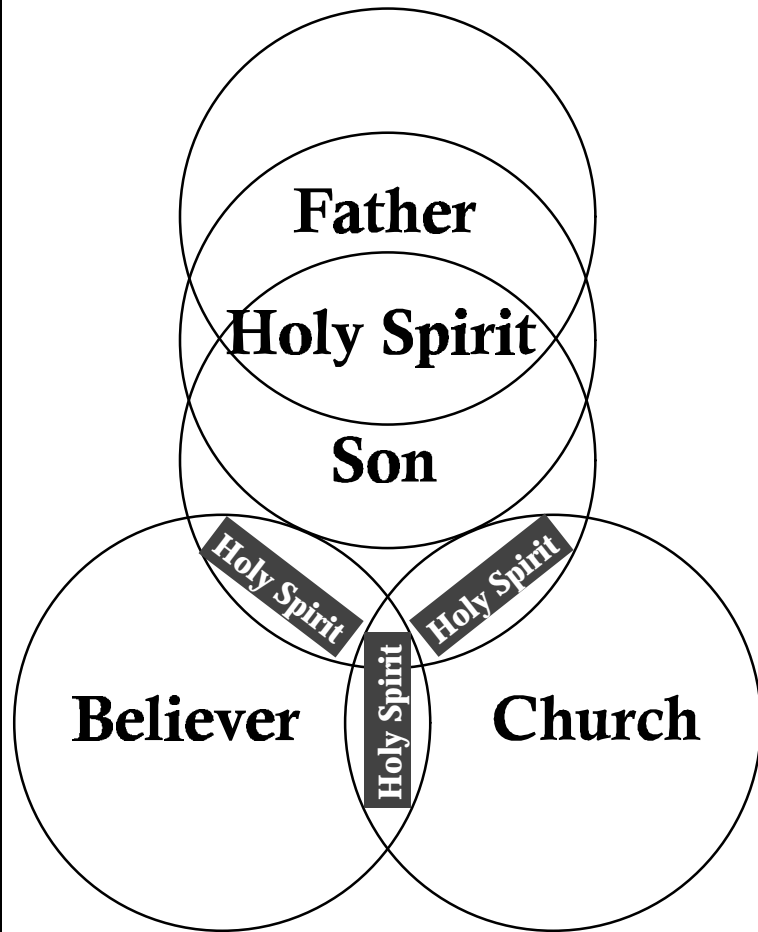

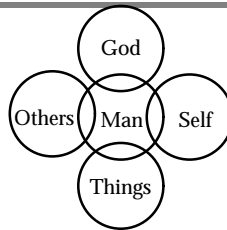

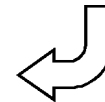

BUILDING ON THE FOUNDATION:

It can be said that sin has as its birthplace, the desire for wrong relationships. Read *Genesis 3:5-6* and *Isaiah 14:12-14*, and compare the original sin of mankind with the original sin of satan, in this regard. What was wrong with the relationship that both sought with God? (see *Gen. 3:6* and *Isa. 14:14*). (Note also the sin of the angels described in *Jude 6*).

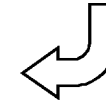
