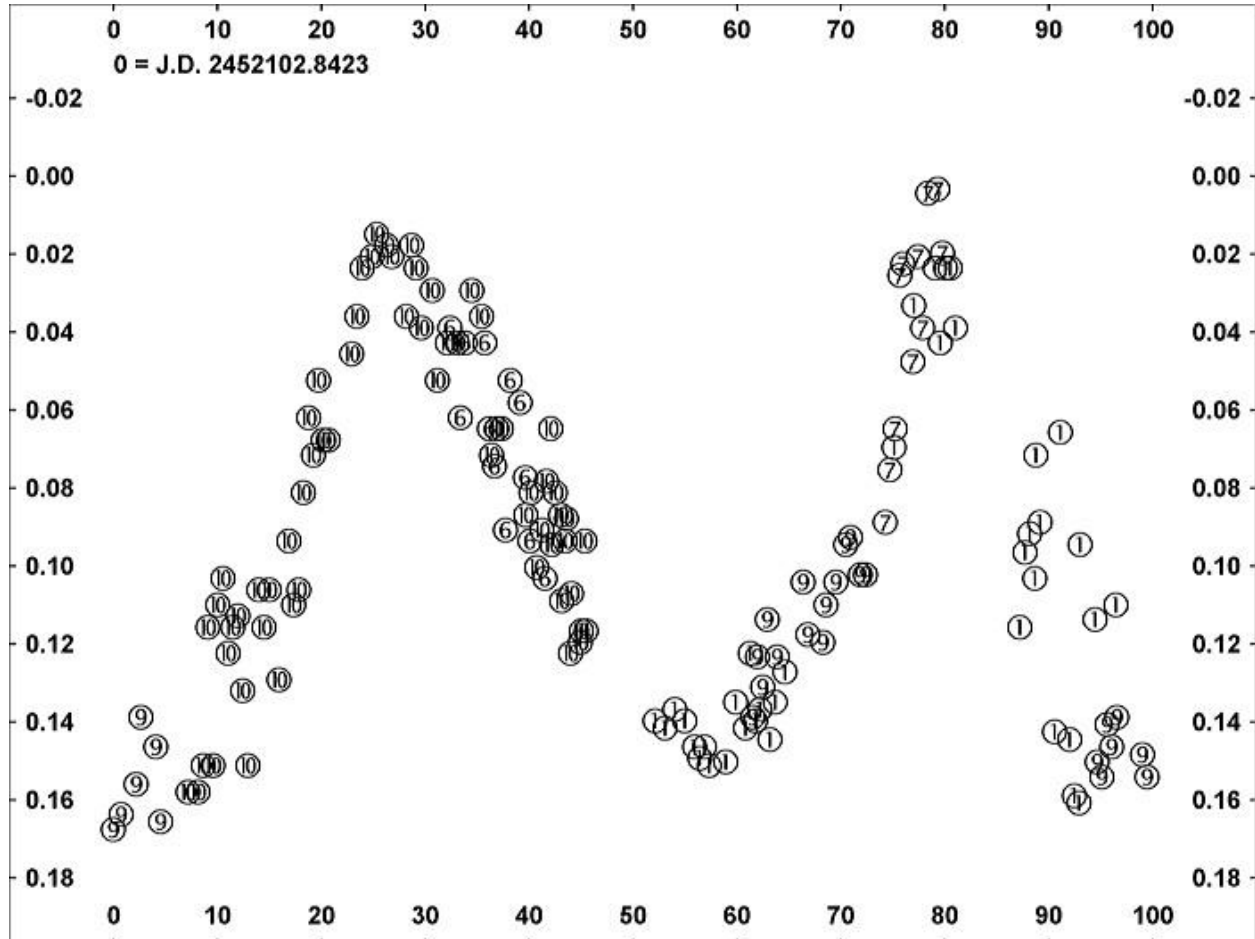


# (1108) Demeter

Dates Observed: July 9 to 29, 2001

Instruments: .28 meter F/9 SCT with a SBIG ST9e CCD Camera

Notes: Demeter is a main-belt asteroid discovered 31 May 1929 by K. Reinmuth at Heidelberg. It is named for the Greek goddess of the fruitful soil and of agriculture.
