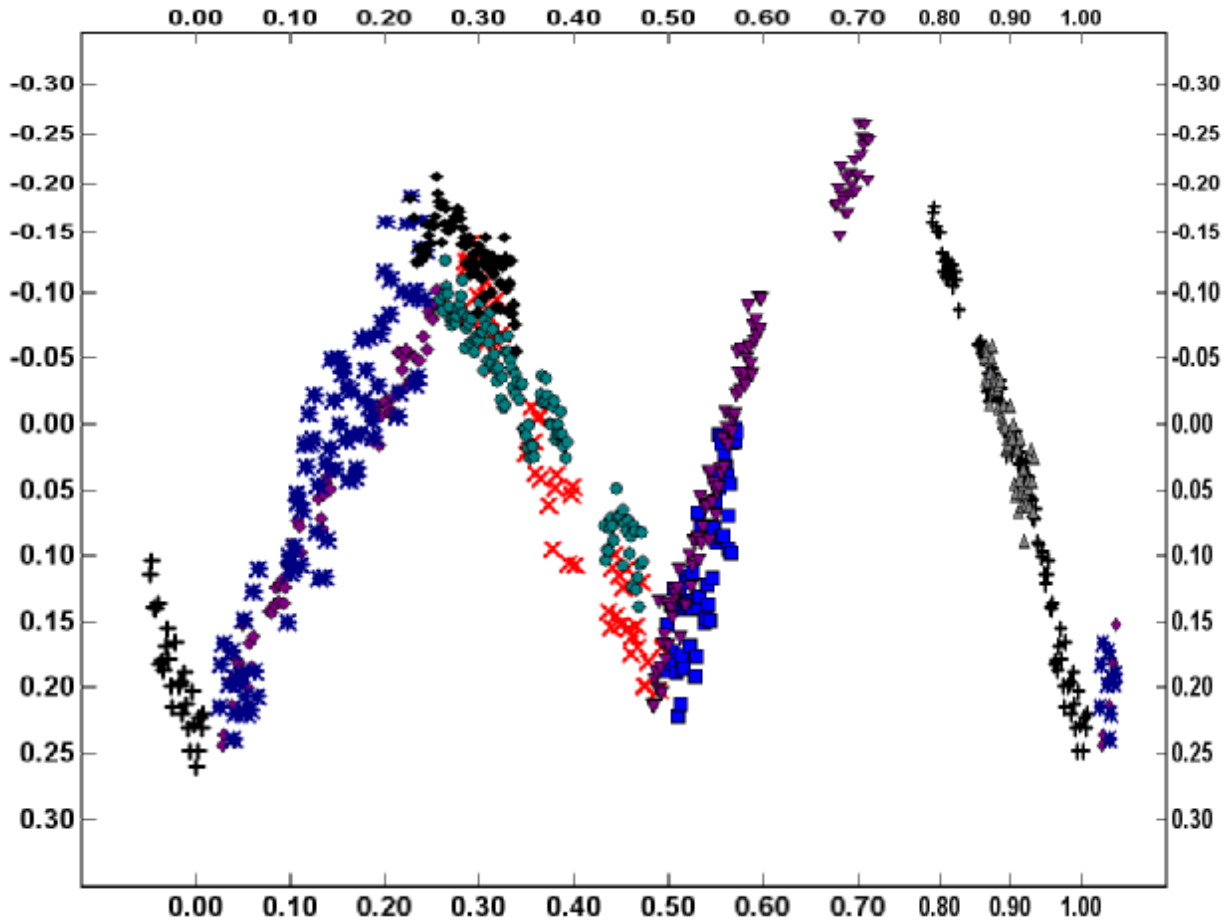

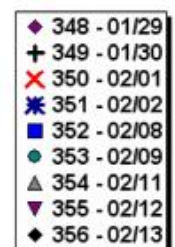

Notes: Discovered March 12, 1936 by E. Delporte at Uccle Parvulesco is a member of the Nysas. It is named in memory of the Roumanian professor Constantin Parvulesco (1890-1945). It also honors his daughter, Carina Parvulesco who, as a professor of astronomy at San Mateo College, California, has made contributions in stellar and galactic dynamics. It also honor her brother, Antares Parvulesco, mathematical physicist and acoustician at the University of Hawaii.
