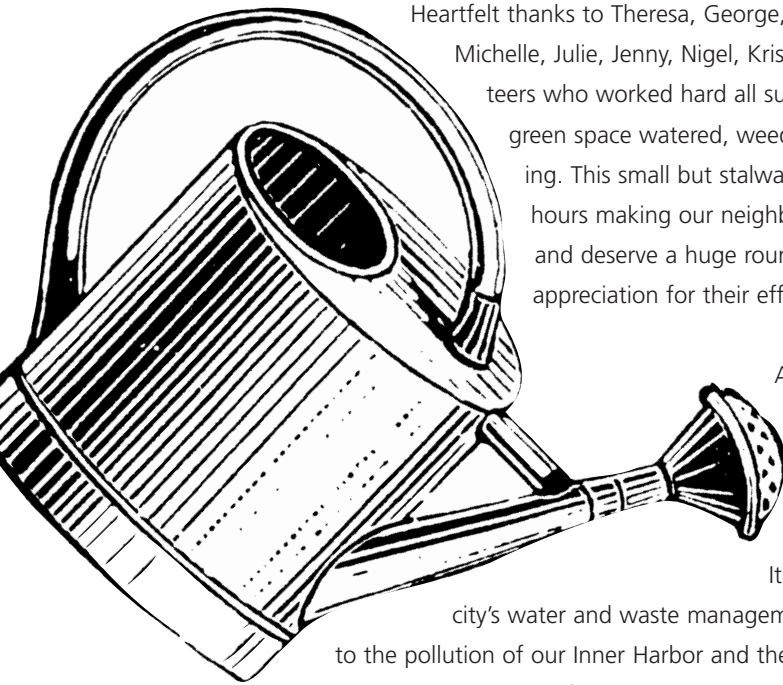

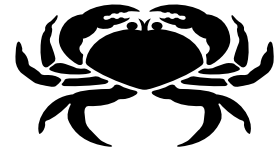
A gentle reminder: Sweeping grass clippings and other yard waste into the street is the same as dumping your trash into the street!

New Towson University policy for off campus students

Towson University has instituted new policies, aimed at curbing disruptive and disorderly behavior among students living in residential areas. According to the August 28th issue of the Towerlight (the campus newspaper), vice president for student affairs Deb Moriarty says that "neighbors should try talking to the students to resolve the problem. If the problems persist, they're invited to call student affairs. Judicial affairs staff will log the complaints and conduct follow-up as necessary. When repeated problems arise, "we will take a variety of steps, depending on the situation, of outreach to the students," Moriarty said. First, a police officer and/or student affairs staff member could visit the home and deliver a verbal warning. If the problems continue, "we will start looking at providing sanctions under the code of conduct," Moriarty said. Sanctions could include probationary status, a community service requirement, or fines, ranging from \$250 to \$500." The number to log complaints: 410-704-5433.
