HARRY B O U T

Harry was born August 19, 1958 in the Dutch town of Zeist.

His parents moved to Michigan.

At home they continued speaking Dutch and stuck to Dutch culture.

From one of his letters :

"Yes. My mother was always speaking Dutch to me.

At home, Dutch always was our first language.

My father who died when I was eight years old, also spoke Dutch to me all the time.

We are a Dutch family."

Harry has remained Dutchman and never applied for American citizenship.

Harry worked as an estate agent.

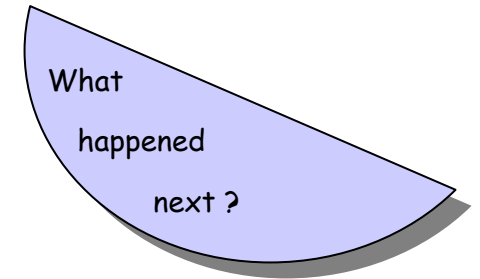
In 1985 a man is killed, a friend of Harry's, in a house belonging to Harry's mother.

At that moment Harry and his girlfriend Dawn Bean are in the house, as well as a lodger, Evelyn Schneider.

At the website of Harry's attorney, James S. Lawrence, a film and photographic evidence can be seen, showing that Harry cannot have committed the murder.

There is a witness (e.g. Ms. Schneider), but when Harry and his girlfriend are arrested the prosecutor changes the photographic evidence as to make Harry look guilty.

The lawyer will show the original proof later on in the case, and comes up with witnesses whose testimony will however not be used.



Harry gets a punishment that will keep him locked up for the rest of his life : life without the possibility of parole.

He is not allowed to inform his consulate or ask assistance.

Therefore, the USA violates the Vienna Convention, which states that foreign residents are entitled to notify their consulate when being imprisoned in a foreign country.

In 2000, after having spent 8 of 16 years in a "maximum security" prison, Harry is transported to a prison with a less severe regime and he has a new lawyer who wants to re-open his case.
